Campaign educates public on ways to prevent identity theft – a growing threat that affected over 16.7 million Americans in 2017

Ford, President and Chief Executive Officer of Central Valley Community Bank (Bank), is pleased to announce their 12th Annual Free Document Shredding events with partner, Pacific Shredding. The events begin Tuesday, April 10, and will run through Tuesday, May 15, 2018, at 20 Bank branch and neighboring locations located throughout the San Joaquin Valley and Greater Sacramento Region.

Bank customers, businesses and the community are invited to attend any of the 20 Document Shredding events for the opportunity to shred confidential files safely, securely and free of charge (up to four banker boxes per person or business and up to shredding truck capacity). Boxes above the limit may be taken to a Pacific Shredding business location and shred for a fee. Participants are asked to bring paper documents only, and to remove binders, metal binder clips and other items in advance of visiting a Document Shredding event. Empty boxes will be returned for personal recycling.

“We pride ourselves on being a trusted resource for customers and the community by providing educational programs like our Annual Document Shredding events strategically held during tax season as a reminder of this important subject,” said James M. Ford, President and CEO of Central Valley Community Bank. “Our goal is to provide a safe and convenient location for community members to shred sensitive documents and to learn helpful tips to protect themselves from identity theft and cybercrimes.”

Understanding how to safely manage both digital and hard copy records has become a complex process for the American public. A recent Identity Fraud Report released by Javelin Strategy & Research earlier this year showed that 16.7 million Americans were affected by identity theft in 2017, an 8% increase from 2016. To counter this problem, Central Valley Community Bank offers

educational tools including its Financial Health Club, an online resource center on their website where the public can easily find the personal and business information they need to keep their finances strong, smooth and most importantly, safe. Educational resources include how to safeguard sensitive data, fraud prevention tips and what to do if you become a victim of identity theft or cybercrime.

“Knowing what documents to save, where and how to save them safely, and how to discard sensitive documents properly can make a world of a difference in protecting yourself or your business against identity theft,” said Sergeant Brian Rogers, Fresno Police Department. “Taking every precaution possible may be difficult, but it is critical to avoid becoming a victim.”
